## A Note From Our School Nurse

It's flu season, and school is a place where germs are shared generously among students, teachers and school staff. The single best way to protect your entire family against flu is for all people aged six months and older to get an influenza vaccine each year. Young children are among those at higher risk of flu complications.

Children, parents and school staff should be vaccinated in the Fall, preferably by the end of October because it takes about two weeks after vaccination for antibodies to develop in the body that protect against flu.

It is especially important for household contacts and caregivers of those with a higher risk for flu-related complications (children <5 years and adults  $\ge 50$  years) to be vaccinated. In addition to the flu shot, you can encourage the following precautions to help stop the spread of germs:

- **Keep kids home when they're sick.** And try to avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue away after use and wash your hands. If a tissue is not available, cover your mouth and nose with your sleeve, not your hands.
- Wash your hands with soap and water often, especially after you cough or sneeze. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand rub.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth. Germs spread this way.

Both children and adults can get vaccinated at their health care providers' office. Adults can also be vaccinated at public clinics or at pharmacies around the state.
